Bowden Heritage Precinct PUBLIC OPEN SPACE



Welcome to today's community drop-in session. We encourage you to view the following information panels, meet the team and ask questions.

Today provides you with an opportunity to learn about and take part in the first stage of the engagement process for designing the public open space for the State Heritage Place, within the broader Bowden Heritage Precinct.

The redevelopment of the six hectare site is the next phase in the transformation of this once industrial area into a peoplecentred and environmentally sustainable neighbourhood that honours and enhances its rich heritage.

The Bowden Heritage Precinct, formerly known as the Brompton Gasworks site, is being cleaned up and redeveloped after standing dormant and fenced off for many years.

Once completed, the Bowden Heritage Precinct is aimed to be a lively and pedestrian-friendly space within the Bowden neighbourhood that balances retail, commercial, residential and community activity for residents and visitors to enjoy.



BOWDEN HERITAGE PRECINCT PROJECT

Bowden is re-emerging as a vibrant inner-city destination.

It mixes the past with the future, blending history, culture and sustainability into a smarter way to live.

The Bowden Master Plan provides for a blend of retail, commercial, residential and community activity set within a balance of heritage and contemporary architecture that celebrates the industrial character of this unique inner city area.



The Bowden Heritage Precinct encompasses six hectares on the former gasworks site, bounded by the Outer Harbour railway line, Drayton, Chief and Second streets.

Renewal SA purchased the site with a vision to revitalise it as part of the 16 hectare Bowden project by transforming it into a lively, pedestrian friendly neighbourhood.




The Bowden Heritage Precinct Master Plan is drawn from the broader Bowden Master Plan and Urban Design Guidelines to ensure continuity and connectivity between the various stages of the overall project. It is focused on a balanced approach to retention and adaptive reuse of the heritage and character structures.



The precinct has long stood dormant as a result of environment issues created by previous heavy industry uses. Before the site can be re-purposed the land must be remediated and independently certified for the intended use.

While remediating the site, over the next 12-18 months, Renewal SA is also planning the public open space within the State Heritage Place and we invite you here today to share your ideas.



HISTORY OF THE BROMPTON GASWORKS

MORE THAN 100 YEARS OF INDUSTRIAL HISTORY

The Gasworks were officially established in 1863 by the South Australian Gas Company (later known as SAGASCO) and were operated for around 140 years by various companies. The most recent of these was Origin Energy, which began winding down operations at the site in the year 2000.



In 1862 the foundation stone was laid in the base of the first smokestack by chairman Henry Ayres. The built form remained relatively unchanged for the first decade, however subsequent changes in technology and business needs have resulted in the site being repeatedly rebuilt.

The Gasworks were a catalyst for industrial expansion in the area, supplying fuel to the new factories which sprung up nearby. The site demonstrates the early pattern of industrial and economic growth in western Adelaide in the 19th and early 20th centuries.

During the first 100 years of the gasworks, coal was burnt at very high heat to produce gas in furnaces known as retorts on the site. The energy produced was used for lighting, heating water and many manufacturing processes.

URBANFUTURE



In the 1960s, the Gasworks transitioned to processing newer products including Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) and natural gas. All the retorts were dismantled as working facilities in 1969.

Acquired by the state government in 2010, the former Gasworks site is the only one of its kind remaining in the

state and this important industrial heritage will be honoured as an integral part of the Bowden Heritage Precinct redevelopment.

In 2015, a section of the site was provisionally entered into the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place. This listing was confirmed in October 2018.

WHAT STRUCTURES HAVE BEEN RETAINED ON SITE?

Eight structures of cultural and historic significance are being retained and integrated with the new development. These structures, as outlined here, reflect Bowden's rich industrial heritage and a strong sense of local identity and place. It is important to note that some structures have previously been known by other names, based on their functions at different times.

The retained structures are intended to be adapted and reused providing a new life while honouring their unique history. They will be integrated within the context of their location in the development and sensitively adapted to suit their new uses. Civil works, including new streets and landscaping will be constructed, together with the development of various buildings to create the Bowden Heritage Precinct. These works are designed to improve accessibility, showcase the retained structures, and accommodate a mix of retail, commercial, residential and community activity.

Individually listed State Heritage structures

RETORT HOUSE



Formerly known as Retort House No. 3, this bluestone structure was built in 1879. Located on the corner of East Street and the Outer Harbor Railway Line corridor, it was once home to retort furnaces used to manufacture gas from coal. More recently used for storage and maintenance.

CHIEF STREET WALL & FRAMEWORK



This prominent bluestone wall and associated metal framework runs along Chief Street and the railway corridor. This structure is the partial remnant of former Retort House No. 4, built in the early 1900s.

GASWORKS CHIMNEY



This striking 21 metre high, red brick chimney stack is another surviving remnant of former Retort House No. 4. The chimney once served as a vent for two retort furnaces and it was previously enclosed within the retort house, with just the top protruding.

State Heritage Place character structures

PURIFYING HOUSE



This random rubble and red brick structure, built in 1873, was originally used for gas purification. After the Second World War the interior was adapted to serve as storerooms, laboratories and amenities rooms for workers.

WORKS SUPER-INTENDENT'S COTTAGE



CARPENTERS' WORKSHOP



Also used as a press shop in a former life, this small bluestone structure was most recently used for storage and maintenance. It is believed to have been built between 1870 and 1880.

CHEMISTRY LABORATORY



Dated between 1870 and 1880, this bluestone structure is believed to have formerly housed the gasworks chemistry laboratory and was last used as an office.

BLUESTONE WALL



This random rubble bluestone wall connects the Chemistry Laboratory and Carpenters' Workshop buildings and showcases the tradition of enclosing the site from the surrounding streets.

RETAINED STRUCTURES



This small bluestone cottage is believed to date to the early years of the gasworks, between 1870 and 1880. It was later used as a meter shop for assembling and testing gas meters.

PUBLIC OPEN SPACE ENGAGEMENT PROCESS

Over the next 12–18 months Renewal SA has planned a comprehensive 3 stage engagement and planning process with the community for designing the public open space in the State Heritage Place – bounded by the Retort House, railway corridor and purifying house. This process includes a blend of interactive methods including face-to-face community drop-in sessions and the online engagement platform Social Pinpoint.


Throughout the process there are various opportunities for you to provide input and share ideas with public realm design consultants ASPECT Studios and our project team.



To ensure continuity and connectivity between the various stages of the overall project, ideas and feedback obtained during the public open space engagement process will be considered in the context of the Bowden Heritage Precinct Master Plan, which is drawn from the broader Bowden Master Plan and Urban Design Guidelines.

BOWDEN MASTER PLAN

The focus of this engagement process is the development of the public open space within the State Heritage listed section of the Bowden Heritage Precinct, known as the Brompton Gasworks. The public open space design is inclusive of future green spaces within the Brompton Gasworks, the interface between the retained structures and the future public open space, and the connections with the broader precinct.

















DESIGN APPROACH

ASPECT Studios
