The Seaton Urban Renewal Demonstration Project (Demonstration Project) is located in the south west corner of the broader Seaton Study Area.

Project Vision

The overarching vision for the broader Seaton Study Area is to revitalise an inner metropolitan precinct of aged public housing stock with up to 1,500 new homes, improved streetscapes and better connections to public transport and community services.

The Demonstration Project will show how community aspirations can inform the design of housing products, open space, streetscape and layout. It will test support for a comprehensive redevelopment and showcase a renewal model for potential application across the wider Seaton Study Area.







Seaton Urban Renewal Demonstration Project

The Seaton Urban Renewal Demonstration Project, delivered by Renewal SA on behalf of the SA Housing Authority, is an important step forward towards the overall delivery of comprehensive neighbourhood renewal and social housing outcomes. Renewal SA is responsible for the planning and delivery of the Demonstration Project, including demolition, civil and landscaping works, vacant land sales and partnering arrangements with builders/developers on behalf of the SA Housing Authority.

It is proposed that the Demonstration Project will deliver approximately 101 dwellings, as well as:

- the provision of a new landscaped reserve;
- retention of existing roadways with a new public road to access vacant land without existing street frontage;
- streetscaping and road treatments that enhance amenity;
- market and affordable housing (houses, townhouses and apartments); and
- well-designed new social housing better suited to customer needs.







The broader Seaton Study Area

In the future, further opportunities for urban renewal in the broader Seaton Study Area (bounded by Frederick Road in the West, Glenburnie Street in the South, Tapleys Hill Road in the East and West Lakes Boulevard in the North) could be considered.

The New Reserve

The Seaton Demonstration Project will include a new landscaped reserve, shown on the map. It will be accessible from the new roadway, Glenburnie Street and Matthews Avenue. The dimensions of the new reserve will have an approximate length of 85.4m and will vary in width from 27.6m to 37.1m, totalling around 2600sqm.

Urban green spaces play an important role in our lifestyle/wellbeing and are available to everyone in the community to enjoy and connect with others. They help meet the community's recreational, sporting, play and social needs, offering a wealth of benefits to individuals, families, communities and the environment.



Open Space




Open space covers the indicative locations for neighbourhood parks and other public spaces, and their intended uses for nearby residents.





Movement




Movement relates to how vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians move through and within the area. It considers connections and shared path links.


Two surveys are included: one seeking your ideas on the reserve; the other for us to learn more about you and your connection to the area.
